

Women's Brains Age More Slowly Than Those Of Men

Good news for women: Your brains age more slowly than males'. According to an article on the NPR website, researchers have found that the metabolism of women's brains remains healthier and more youthful than that of their male counterparts, making women better equipped to be creative during the later years of their lives.

The findings come from a study of 205 brain scans of people ages 20–82. At first scientists studied brain metabolisms to determine a person's age. Then they observed a significant difference between the age of some people's brains and their chronological ages, leading to the discovery that older women's brains, on average, were about four years younger in terms of metabolism than men's brains. The reason is unknown, but the scientists say a higher brain metabolism may give women an advantage in learning and creativity as they age.

The Peppa Effect

There's an interesting phenomenon sweeping across the U.S.: Toddlers and young children are speaking the Queen's English.

"Mom" and "dad" have been replaced by "mummy" and "daddy." Children are asking to go on holidays, referring to money in pounds, and saying that they want to do things straight away. Sometimes there are snorts and oinks interjected in their speech. Most of this is being chronicled on Twitter under the hashtag #PeppaEffect, because it turns out a pig named Peppa is behind it all.

Peppa Pig is an animated character on an eponymous children's show from the U.K. Episodes air on cable channels worldwide and are available on YouTube. There's a website with short videos and activities, so if your kids have access and screen time, there is a good chance they will encounter Peppa and fall under her influence.

All of this is quite normal, really. (Say that with a British accent.) Research suggests that children begin to develop their accents around the age of 20 months. For fans of the show ages 2 to 5—Peppa's main demographic—their love of the character and delight in her antics inspire them to mimic her behavior and language. They don't even recognize Peppa's accent as being different from their own.

Children should be provided with activities that encourage them to talk a lot. This will help them to increase their use of words and improve their communications skills.

Get Your Business Up And Running With These Tactics

Attitude Affects Performance

Your child's ability to solve problems, tackle math equations, and excel in science and other subjects might have a lot to do with your outlook on life

Researchers in the U.S. and the U.K. analyzed data from several studies and found that parents who believed that luck or fate plays a crucial role in determining events in their lives tended to have children who underperformed academically. In contrast, parents who felt that they had influence or power over life events tended to raise children who performed better in school.

Other factors involving early childhood development, such as having stories read to them and exposure to creative and educational activities outside the home, also played a role in academic success. Additional research even showed that college-age students with more positive and empowered viewpoints also had success during this period of higher learning.

Because the study did not specifically measure parental influence on children's attitudes later in life, researchers could not verify that upbeat parents raise upbeat kids. Yet the one constant that seems to keep being revealed is that success has a lot to do with one's outlook on the ability to shape his or her future.
