

Exotic Pets: Tiger King Is Just One Example

The Netflix documentary Tiger King: Murder, Mayhem and Madness may have become a hit due to its lurid true-crime details and eccentric cast of stranger-than-fiction characters, but it also brought to the forefront the lucrative, illicit, and largely obscured global market of exotic pets - one that has a legacy going back decades among the rich and eccentric. Tiger King seems ridiculous now, but for centuries, keeping exotic animals as pets was a trendy lark for eccentrics with deep pockets, regardless of the consequences.

Ornamental goldfish imported from China were a blossoming trend in 17th-century Europe, but without access to natural spring water, many Westerners struggled to keep their fish alive. In the early 19th century, Robert Warrington built the first modern aquarium, which he modeled with the ecosystem in mind.

While introducing plant oxygen improved water quality and gave goldfish a fighting chance, ornamentals remained a rare and expensive treasure in North America until the Industrial Revolution. Many birds now considered common - such as canaries, zebra finches, and parakeets - were first brought to America in the early 1900s. Expanded trade routes sent fish, birds, and other small game from Europe to North America.

In the US, aviculture became popular among hobbyists, while Belgian hares were viewed as both companion animals and a source of food. For Christmas in 1951, actress Beatrice Lillie purchased an alligator for her lover, the playwright Noël Coward, from the

pet store in Harrods of London. The famed department store opened its 11,000-square-foot Pet Kingdom in 1917. To make sure only the most well-heeled patrons could reach it, the store installed England's first moving staircase and implemented a ritzy dress code.

For more than 50 years, Harrods sold tigers, panthers, camels, elephants, pedigreed dogs and cats, and a vast array of exotic animals that rivaled the London Zoo in both number and presentation. Pet Kingdom stopped selling most exotic animals in 1976. The department was replaced with more womenswear; but in 2007, Harrods hired an Egyptian cobra to guard a pair of Caovilla ruby-, sapphire-, and diamond-encrusted sandals worth \$120,000.

Around the turn of the 20th century, a handful of societies had been established in Great Britain and the United States to advocate for animal rights. Among them circulated a chilling novel by American journalist Upton Sinclair, who depicted "squeals and lifeblood ebbing away together" in the Chicago meat-packing district. The exotic animal trade continued to grow in America. For Thanksgiving dinner in 1926, a raccoon, Rebecca, was transported from Mississippi to the White House to serve the Coolidge family's dinner plates, but when the First Family met Rebecca, they refused to hurt her. The Coolidge White House was nicknamed the Pennsylvania Avenue Zoo, and rightfully so: The family kept a pygmy hippo, two lion cubs, and a bear.

Many of the era's greatest artists were inspired by their exotic pets. Considering the despair that riddled Frida Kahlo's lifetime, it's no wonder she centered her spirits on painting and caring for those monkeys, deer, and exotic birds often depicted alongside her. During WWII, burlesque dancer Josephine Baker brought her pet cheetah on stage for a performance. Baker unleashed Chiquita on the unsuspecting audience, causing everyone in sight to scramble.

Even Elvis bought into the exotic pet trend; after purchasing Graceland, Elvis transformed the estate with his own menagerie of pigs, monkeys, peacocks, and a flock of geese to help trim the lawns.

The 1990s were a perfect storm for the reptile and amphibian trades. Iguana and small turtle farming turned exotic, scaled animals into dime-store commodities. Between 1989 and 1997 alone, more than 18.3 million live reptiles were imported into the United States. Many reptiles perish at the hands of their reckless captors, or from poor care during shipment and in underground markets. They are the most inhumanely treated animals in the pet trade, and are considered cheap and easily replaceable by dealers and retailers, who factor high mortality rates into their budgets. An estimated 90% of wild-caught reptiles perish in their first year of captivity due to physical trauma experienced before they were purchased, or because their owners fail to provide for their complex dietary and habitat needs. Exotic pets have been popular throughout the last 100 years or so, but they are still wild, and they are still animals. They are meant to be free-and hopefully shows like Tiger King won't inspire this trend to grow.

National Good Car-Keeping Month

Clean it out. Get it tuned up. Change the oil. Rotate the tires. Take time to make sure your car has undergone necessary repairs and is up to date on scheduled maintenance.

Corona Financial Resources

- 1. No Foreclosures: The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development has placed a moratorium on foreclosures if your loan is backed by Fannie Mae or Freddie Mac (most loans are so please call your mortgage company to ask).
- **2. Pause Mortgage Payments:** The Federal Housing Finance Agency (FHFA) announced earlier this month that Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac will provide payment forbearance for single-family residences provided borrowers could demonstrate financial hardship due to COVID-19. The forbearance can last as long as a year.

FHFA also said that Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac will grant mortgage forbearance to owners of multifamily properties in exchange for suspending evictions.

The forbearance is simply a pause on having to make your mortgage payments. Interest will still accrue during that time and will be added to your balance.

Additionally, there is some confusion as to what will happen at the end of the forbearance. Will the past due amount be due in a lump sum? Will it be added to the end of the loan? These items will vary from lender to lender, so please make sure you ask diligent questions.

How to Take Advantage: Call your mortgage servicer (the company on your mortgage statement), ask them if your loan is backed by Fannie Mae or Freddie Mac (chances are high it is), and ask them about pausing your mortgage payments.

3. Student Loan Debt: On March 13, President Trump said all interest on federal student loans would be waived for the duration of the coronavirus emergency. Additionally, you can put your monthly payments on pause for at least 60 days during the crisis. (Hint: you could actually already do this!)

4. Federal Tax Filing: The IRS has pushed federal Tax Day from April 15 to July 15. You no longer need to file or pay until July 15.



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Beware of Robo Calls

Assistant Director, Division of Consumer and Business Education, FTC

Scammers – and scammy companies – are using illegal robocalls to profit from Coronavirus-related fears. Listen to some of the latest scammy robocall pitches, so you can be on the lookout and know how to respond. (Here's a hint: hang up!)

Illegal robocalls are universally hated, so why do scammers still use them? Because they need only a few people to take the bait for them to make money. They might do that by getting your bank account number, tricking you into handing over gift card PIN codes, or stealing valuable personal information like your Social Security number.

Times of crisis bring out the best in people, and the worst in scammers. To hear more examples of illegal robocalls exploiting concerns about the Coronavirus, and to stay up to date on the latest FTC information, visit ftc.gov/coronavirus. The FTC is taking the fight against illegal Coronavirus robocalls to companies that help scammy telemarketers. That includes companies that transmit or carry these kinds of calls for telemarketers, or that give the phone numbers that scammers use for people to call them back. Today, the FTC sent letters to nine VoIP providers and companies that license phone numbers, warning them about the penalties for helping telemarketers that use these kinds of illegal robocalls.

If you get a spammy, robocall:

- Hang up. Don't press any numbers. The recording might say that pressing
 a number will let you speak to a live operator or remove you from their
 call list, but it might lead to more robocalls, instead.
- Consider using a call blocking app or device. You also can ask your phone
 provider if it has call-blocking tools. To learn more, go to ftc.gov/calls.
- Report the call. Report robocalls at ftc.gov/complaint. The more we hear from you, the more we can help fight scams.

Astronomers Spot The Biggest Black Hole Explosion Ever

Imagine an explosion. A big one. Are you thinking of a nuclear bomb? Think bigger. As the U.S. News & World Report website reports, astronomers have detected an explosion in the distant universe that blasted a crater in the hot galactic gas around it large enough to hold 15 Milky Way galaxies. That's big—the biggest ever discovered, in fact.

A supermassive black hole in a galactic cluster some 390 million light-years away was responsible for the blast. Black holes don't just suck matter in—they also spew matter and energy out. This one is at the center of a group of thousands of galaxies known as the Ophiuchus cluster, and was discovered by scientists using NASA's space-based Chandra X-Ray Observatory, in cooperation with ground telescopes in Australia and India, along with a European space observatory.

The explosion was five times the size of the previously-known biggest outer space explosion. More recent observations show that no more jets of energy and matter came from the black hole after the event. Scientists plan to make further observations in different wavelengths to better understand the causes of the colossal blast.
