Election Facts for Colorado

- When is the deadline to register to vote? The deadline is Monday, Oct. 26. Election Day is Tuesday, Nov. 3.
- When is the deadline to request a mail-in ballot?
 All registered voters receive their mail ballot automatically
- When do I need to mail my ballot by?
 Must be received by Tuesday, Nov. 3 (Election Day)
- Can I drop off my ballot in person?
 Yes in designated ballot boxes.
- After I vote by mail, can I track my ballot? https://www.sos.state.co.us/voter/pages/pub/olvr/findVoterReg.xhtml
- Can I vote in person before Election Day?
 Yes, but only early in-person voting.

- 1. **Aspen:** This beautiful mountain town, named for its aspen groves, turns brilliant gold in the fall season. There is a wonderful place along Maroon Creek near aspen.
- **2. Telluride:** If you're in search of beautiful fall foliage, then you'll want to check out Telluride.
- 3. Crested Butte: Crested Butte is one of the best towns in the state to see fall colors! It's also known as the wildflower capital of Colorado. Kebler Pass is so incredibly stunning and full of beautiful gold!
- 4. Estes Park: Rocky Mountain National Park explodes in beautiful fall splendor. Longs Peak, Bear Lake and the park hosting miles and miles of hiking trails, numerous alpine lakes and fabulous views.

In 2020, the Great Conjunction will be a true phenomenon. The large planets will appear closer than they have since before 1000 AD, and it won't happen again until the year 7541. To say it's a rarity is an understatement, and this very special year, it also happens on the winter solstice. 
