Fencing In The Neighborhood

Summer is prime time for replacing fencing in the neighborhood. There are a few things however to know before you replace your fence. Article II, section 2 of the covenants talks about the procedure to follow when making plans to replace or add a

> fence. Plans must be submitted to the board. There are forms on the website for this purpose. And a permit must be taken out with Jefferson County.

> Article III, section 17 covers the kinds of materials that can be used. A question that has come up recently is whether or not we can use plastic or recycled materials for fencing and the answer is no according to our covenants. Fences must be made of wood or masonry. The covenants can be found on our website, Williamsburg2hoa.com.
