A drum circle is just what it sounds like, children and adults sitting in a circle with a drum or flat surface to drum or tap their hands on. Drumming is a form of non-verbal communication that can improve social and emotional well-being as well as enhance the physical, and cognitive development of children. Drum circles encourage play while giving your child a chance to express him or herself through rhythmic energy. Think about it as communicating and exercising their brains and bodies through beats within a social setting. When children listen to music or rhythms, they can feel it both physically and emotionally, especially when they are able to dance, bang on a drum, or tap their feet to the beat.
