Neighborhood Safety Reminder: Watch Out For E-Bikes and E-Scooters

A neighbor recently shared a close call that serves as an important reminder for everyone — drivers, parents, and young riders alike.

While turning into the neighborhood off Kipling onto Roxbury around 5:10 p.m., a driver and the vehicle in front of them nearly collided with three teenagers crossing the street on electric bikes. The riders were dressed in black and difficult to see, especially in the evening light. Thankfully, no one was hurt, but it was a frightening moment for everyone involved. As more e-bikes and e-scooters appear around our neighborhood, it's important to remember:

- **Riders:** Please wear visible clothing, use lights, and always slow down at intersections — even when you have the right of way. Remember, e-bikes and e-scooters should be operated on the road or in designated bike lanes, *not on sidewalks.*
- **Parents:** Talk with your kids about road safety and visibility, especially at dusk or in shaded areas.

• **Drivers:** Stay alert for smaller, faster-moving bikes or scooters that might be harder to see — particularly near crosswalks and turns.

We all share the same roads. A little extra awareness and care can go a long way in keeping everyone safe.

Friendly Reminder:

To keep our neighborhood safe and looking great, please be sure that any vehicles parked on the street are operable and have current license plate tags. The Jefferson County Sheriff's Office may issue citations for unlicensed or inoperable vehicles.

How To Observe Wreaths Across America Day

All across the country, volunteers come together to lay wreaths on the grave sites of the military. You can help by volunteering, too. Bring your children, no matter their age. It's an excellent opportunity to teach them about the sacrifices our military and their families make and show respect for our military. You can also donate to make sure every fallen hero is honored. Many volunteers start by laying wreaths for their family members but find they continue to help each year. The meaning of a somber commitment of honoring service members with a wreath grows every year.

Holiday Decorations And Pets

Christmas trees and holiday greens: Make sure your dogs or cats do not chew on limbs or droppings from the tree. Ingested pine needles could get lodged in the intestinal tract, puncturing the lining or bunching together and causing an intestinal obstruction.

- **Water base:** The water base of a Christmas tree may contain dangerous chemicals that could harm your pet.
- **Christmas lights and tinsel:** Position your tree's lights and tinsel away from the bottom of the tree where pets can reach them. Some pets climb up or into trees and can even knock them over. If swallowed, tinsel can be very dangerous to cats.
- **Candles:** Don't leave candles unattended. Pets may accidentally knock them over and spill wax or start a fire.
- **Firestarter logs:** Dogs that enjoy chewing should steer clear; these logs contain sawdust and paraffin which can cause an irritated stomach or even intestinal blockage when ingested.
- **Plants:** A number of seasonal plants are poisonous to pets if nibbled or eaten, including ivy, holly, mistletoe and poinsettias.

TRAIL OF LIGHTS
